<b>ACCESS for English Language Learners</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>English Language assessment; <b>State-required for ELLs only</b></li><li>Identifies English proficiency level in reading, writing, speaking, listening</li><li>3 hours, 1 x per year</li></ul>	12/2 – 1/31
<b>Advanced Placement (AP)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>Student choice</b></li><li>32 test offered across different subjects</li><li>Allows students to earn college credit depending on the institution</li></ul>	5/4 – 5/15
<b>Note:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Each school schedules its testing times to fall within these dates. Students are <b>not</b> testing the entire time during these dates. Contact your school for details.</li></ul>
