

iReady Math

2018-19 Academic Year

What is it?

iReady Math helps identify student strengths and struggles are relative to the standards. It measures growth over time, and supports data-driven differentiated instruction. It also provides teachers and administrators with detailed reports to help understand what each student can do and the next steps to inform instruction.

Why is this assessment given?

The diagnostic will provide another data point for middle schools as decisions are made about math class placement in 6th grade; whether in a 6th grade core course, which looks at all of 6th grade standards within one year, or a 6/7a core course, which looks at all of 6th grade standards and half of the 7th grade standards within one year. This assessment, along with teacher recommendation, grades and MAP data, will provide middle schools with data to make final decisions.

Who takes this assessment?

All Grade 5 students will take the iReady, as appropriate.

How is the test given?

i-Ready Math is an online, adaptive assessment. It is given to students in Grade 5 to help inform math course selection for Middle School.

When is the test given?

This test will be given in mid-winter. It takes approximately one hour for a student to complete it.

How will results be shared?

Results will be shared with families as soon as possible after completion of the test.

Staff will have the results shared with them shortly after test completion to help with instructional planning.

How does this assessment reflect my child's performance?

As with any assessment, this is only one measure of your student's academic performance. It is only through *multiple* assessments (for example, teacher developed assessments, state and district assessments) that we are able to develop a clearer picture of your student's current level of performance as well as their growth over time.
